



















## A NOTE FROM OUR BOARD PRESIDENT



The past year marked an important milestone: the 60th anniversary of The SF Market's move from its original downtown location to our current campus in Bayview Hunters Point. The anniversary was a great chance to reflect on The SF Market's enduring tradition as a home for small businesses and strong generational relationships. Many of The SF Market's marquee achievements last year underscore our core role as a leader and partner in food systems in the Bay Area and beyond. As Board President, I observed many examples in 2023 of how, day in and day out, The SF Market is a catalyst for critical access to the food infrastructure, programs, and relationships that help farmers, local food businesses, and communities thrive.

Among the commemoration activities, we were grateful to Mayor London Breed for recognizing our legacy with a Proclamation of San Francisco Market Day. We also joined the City's Department of Public Works to support restoration of the Colombo Market Arch, the last remaining architectural fragment from the historic Produce District where The SF Market was born more than a century ago. It was a thrill to help preserve this significant artifact from San Francisco's past at Sydney G. Walton Square Park.

I have watched The SF Market's visibility grow in recent years; we often welcome high-profile visitors to learn more about how our unique mix of programs and commerce supports the region's food infrastructure. An impressive highlight occurred in November, when The SF Market stepped into the global spotlight to host an Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) leaders' summit. Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and other prominent stakeholders across agriculture, tech, government, and academia visited our campus for a roundtable conversation on food accessibility and affordability.

With a bright future ahead, we are also engaging with the next generation of leaders. We were pleased to host the 2023 National Association for Industrial and Office Parks (NAIOP) San Francisco Bay Area Real Estate Challenge, in which graduate students at the University of California Berkeley Haas School of Business and the Stanford Business School compete at devising solutions for real-world real estate development projects. To support our Reinvestment Plan, the teams explored strategies for upgrading buildings on The SF Market campus. The competition was stiff, but the Cal Berkeley team took home the Golden Shovel for an impressive reimagining of our campus for a new era of logistics.

One of the most important outcomes of 2023 was passing the milestone of recovering 7 million pounds of fresh produce through our acclaimed Food Recovery Program. Since 2016, our commitment to feeding neighbors in need has rallied 75 community partners to generate 5,830,000 meals. The SF Market's innovative, award-winning program reduces food waste and food insecurity by directing edible surplus produce to community partner organizations throughout the Bay Area.

With much to look forward to, as 2023 drew to a close I was also looking ahead to my sixth and final year of service on The SF Market Board. As I prepare to pass the gavel to new Board leadership, I am filled with gratitude for the opportunity to have spent time as a colleague of The SF Market's small but impressive professional staff, the amazing Merchant entrepreneurs whose nightly labors keep a bounty of healthy and delicious fruit and vegetables on the dinner plates of those of us who are fortunate enough to live in the Bay Area, and the diverse and talented volunteers who serve on the Board and Board Committees. As exemplified by the above highlights from 2023, The SF Market has a long track record of making a difference and growing relationships, opportunities, and resilience throughout the region. It has been an immense honor to participate in this mission for awhile, and I will depart with the highest confidence that The SF Market will continue as a treasured local resource, creating value and improving the quality of life in the Bay Area for many more years into the future.

# ENVISIONING OUR FUTURE: SITE OF THE NAIOP BAY AREA REAL ESTATE CHALLENGE

As we continued to advance the next phase of our Reinvestment Plan, we were privileged to be selected as the site for the 2023 NAIOP San Francisco Bay Area Real Estate Challenge. This prestigious competition between real estate graduate students at the UC Berkeley Haas School of Business and the Stanford Business School challenges students to devise solutions for complicated real-world real estate development projects. The teams were tasked with determining the best strategy for improving the four main warehouses on our main campus. The UC Berkeley team won the competition by proposing a series of innovative approaches to address the equity challenges of our project and prepared us for a new era of logistics and delivery. Our Reinvestment Project team, Real Estate Development Committee and Board were greatly impressed by the results of the competition and inspired to consider integrating the ideas into our project moving forward.







# THE SF MARKET FOOD RECOVERY PROGRAM: 7 MILLION LBS. MILESTONE SNAPSHOT

In 2023, our Food Recovery Program achieved the monumental milestone of recovering 7,000,000 pounds of fresh, culturally diverse produce since the program's launch in 2016. Through partnerships with our dedicated merchants and community partners, the program recovers fresh surplus produce that would otherwise go to waste and redistributes it to those in need across the San Francisco and the greater Bay Area region. This milestone not only celebrates past achievements but also motivates ongoing efforts to build a more resilient food system for all.



## **2023 FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT**


### **REVENUE**
